

How to implement a "Racial Understanding, Social Equity, and Environmental Justice" Symposium

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STEP 1:

Invite people from different racial, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds to participate in the symposium.



STEP 2:

Build empathy. Empathy is the ability to recognize other people's emotions and understand their situations, feelings, and challenges. Foster empathy within participants by conducting activities that require people to ask questions and immerse themselves in others' situations. This will help them connect with and appreciate the differences between their peers.



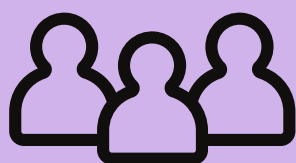
STEP 3:

Deep Discussion. This session is aimed towards conducting honest and open dialogues to brainstorm creative and innovative ideas to mitigate the discrimination and racial issues that occur within society.



STEP 4:

Connect previous discussions to environmental justice. Participants should identify links between racial equity and environmental justice and explain the importance of environmental justice. They can also brainstorm ideas to ensure environmental justice within their communities.
